We now have a date for the community lantern-making workshop from 3.15pm to 5.15pm on Thursday 22nd November. The workshop is for anyone who would like to come and make a lantern with their child in order to take part in the parade of lights in St Ives on 1st December. It is very kindly being funded by the FOSUA. In addition, we are hoping to have a workshop in school time for Y6 and Reception pupils to make a large lantern to be carried in the parade. There will be a letter coming home next week for you to let us know if you would like to take part.

If wet or too windy on 22nd November, we will have to cancel tennis club because the hall will be full!



We are planning an RE day on 7th December on the theme of 'Why is Christmas important to Christians?' Y1 to Y4 (Tehidy, Poldark, Kynance, Godrevy, Mousehole and St Ives) are going to start their day with a special service at St Uny church. This is a service for the children led by members of local churches. Please could parents drop children there between 9am and 9.15am. Poldark and Kynance are staying to do a workshop about stained glass windows afterwards. We will minibus all the children back to school.

Y5 (Ding Dong) will go swimming as normal and have a class assembly at the end of the day. Y6 and Reception (Wheal Dream and Carn Brea are going to have their own special worship time together in school.) All classes are going to do an RE lesson that day and we will post pictures of their learning on the class pages.
