Enalish

Daily guided reading: fiction, non-fiction and poetry/video.

Non-chronological reports about Russia.

Children will learn about paragraphs, subheadings and conjunctions and use them to write a fact file about Russia.

Traditional tales ('skazka' a Russian fantasy tale)

Children will read Baboushka and the Three Kings to learn about Russian winter traditions.

Instruction text.

Using imperative (bossy) verbs, chronological order and time adverbs to write Russian recipes.

Maths

Add and subtract numbers with up to 4 digits using the formal written methods of columnar addition and subtraction where appropriate.

Estimate and use inverse operations to check answers to a calculation.

Solve addition and subtraction two step problems in contexts, deciding which operations and methods to use and why.

Multiplying and dividing by 1,0,10 and 100.

Times tables fluency daily.

Science

- identify common appliances that run on electricity;
- construct a simple series electrical circuit, identifying and naming its basic parts, including cells, wires, bulbs, switches and buzzers;
- identify whether or not a lamp will light in a simple series circuit, based on whether or not the lamp is part of a complete loop with a battery;
- recognise that a switch opens and closes a circuit and associate this with whether or not a lamp lights in a simple series circuit;
- recognise some common conductors and insulators, and associate metals with being good conductors.

- Make clear links between the story of Noah and the idea of covenant.
- Make links between the story of Noah and how we live in school and the wider world.
- Make simple links between promises in the story of Noah and promises that Christians make at a wedding ceremony.
