#### SEND (Special Educational Needs and Disability) Provision at St Uny

Mrs Brand is our SEND Coordinator. She returned from maternity leave at the end of last term so Mrs Hilary Palmer (not to be confused with Mrs Palmer who teaches St Ives!) is no longer with us. Mrs Brand is an experienced SENDco and is working three days a week this term. Enriching and developing our provision for pupils with additional needs is one of our priorities this year and we will keep you informed of our progress.

#### **New Behaviour Policy**

We have a new behaviour policy which we feel better reflects our Christian ethos and values. The focus is on expected behaviour for all. There are still rewards for 'shining examples' and whole class team work as well as simple sanctions that enable a child to reflect on their behaviour with an adult and learn to make a better choice next time.

Teachers will always raise concerns about your child's behaviour with you, but we want this to be proportionate and to encourage children, with support, to take responsibility for their own behaviour. The new policy is being sent out with this newsletter and if anything is unclear please talk to the class teacher. It will be introduced to children on Monday in collective worship and in operation after that.

We aim to be a positive, loving school where children are equipped to live well with Jesus Christ and with others.
