Dear parents and carers,

Some recent frosty weather has really got us in the mood to explore winter with our senses on Monday. So don't forget it's 'Winter Weather Day' and all children should come in their own, warm winter clothes with a coat as everyone will be going outside come rain or shine!

School Meal Debt Policy for parents

Unfortunately, the school is currently owed over £300 for meals. If debts are incurred, then the school budget has to pay for them which means funds are taken from money allocated to us for pupils' education. The school only has a duty to provide free meals for those who are eligible. It is otherwise a parent's responsibility to pay for meals or provide a packed lunch.

Historically, this school has been very tolerant of debt as no one likes having to ask for money or to take a hard line but the result is that some parents are taking advantage of this and more robust action is needed.

If you think you are eligible for free school meals please speak to the office staff. If you are experiencing temporary financial difficulties, ask to speak to the Head of School in confidence and we can agree a temporary debt and payment plan. Otherwise, all meals must be paid for in advance on Parentpay.

From January 2019, meals will not be provided unless paid for in advance. Parents will be contacted to put money on Parentpay or bring in a packed lunch. We will be contacting parents who currently owe money to settle these debts by the end of term.

The new debt policy is on our website under policies and also applies to debts incurred for Breakfast and After School Club. From January 2019, we will not accept bookings for children at these clubs where the weekly bill has not been settled unless a payment plan has been agreed.

Did you ever stop to wonder what sets apart the really successful students from the average ones? Why do some students who appear to study all the time just get by, while others who don't appear to put in as much time and effort do well? Is it all related to IQ and genetics or are some other factors involved? The truth is that success in school is not so much determined by sheer intelligence as knowing how to study.
