Attendance

I am glad to see that overall, our school attendance is improving. There are only a few persistent absentees (pupils with attendance below 90%) with no valid reason for this absence. Thank you for keeping us informed of the reasons for your child's absence. We will let parents know each month in writing if their child's attendance is a cause for concern.

Having given it a great deal of thought, we do want to continue to support parents who work in the tourist industry to have holidays with their families but need to reduce the amount of time children are missing from school so that they can make more progress. 10 days absence from school means missing nearly 50 hours of lessons. We therefore need to work towards changing the way that leave is requested by those that qualify for exceptional circumstances by gradually reducing the amount of leave that we will authorise.

From January 2019, we will only authorise 7 days holiday under our 'exceptional circumstances' rule and strongly encourage parents to use a few days of a school holiday if they want a longer break. We are going to have curriculum enrichment weeks at the end of each half-term and term and encourage parents who need to take holiday in term-time to use these weeks when pupils will miss less new learning.

The law allows schools and local authorities to issue fixed penalty notices if a pupil has 10 sessions (5 days) of unauthorised absence in 100 days (10 weeks.) Their overall attendance would also be considered.

We will not be providing education packs but in order to authorise exceptional circumstance holiday, require each child to keep a diary or scrapbook about their travels which we will put on display in our 'Where in the world?' section in the library.

We regret that we are unable to authorise absence for birthday treats, family visits or other special occasions unless there are extenuating compassionate reasons. We will consider each request for absence individually but will be unlikely to authorise any leave if the child's attendance is below 96%.

Leave already requested and approved will not be affected by the new policy.
