The West Cornwall Beekeepers held their annual Honey Show on Monday evening December 3rd.

As a member of the WCBKA I entered two identical 454gm jars of honey from the St Uny Academy apiary in the Light Honey Class. This indicates the colour of the honey as opposed to medium or dark honey. A professional show judge, Mr John Roberts spent almost 2 hours scrutinising every entry marking for colour accuracy, absolute clarity, taste and the total absence of foreign matter and air bubbles from every jar. At the end of this process I was awarded Second Prize in the Light Honey Class. Our bees at St Uny Academy have now won their first award for quality excellence!

Our honey is an excellent antidote for those who suffer from hay fever and who live within a 1 mile radius of the school. In total we produced 67 jars this year and all but a few have now been sold to staff and parents. You will have to be very quick to secure one from the office!
