TOPIC	World War 2



6 Points	Research and build your own bomb shelter out of junk. What do you think it should have been made out of? What do you think needed to be in there?	Find out how life changed for women during World War 2. Make a poster explaining the new things that they had to do and why. A good website to look at is primaryhomeworkhelp.co.uk/war/women	Find out all that you can about Winston Churchill and present it in a way that will be interesting to others. Who was he and what did he do? Why was he so important in WW2?
5 Points	Make do and mend - new things were few and far between during the War. People were encouraged to mend clothes and toys rather than buy new ones. Can you make something new out of something old?	Sugar was rationed during the World War 2. People used vegetables to add sweetness to cakes in place of sugar. Can you make a cake that includes vegetables?	Imagine that you have been evacuated from a city during World War 2. Write a letter to your family letting them know what you have been doing in your new home in the countryside.
4 Points	During World War 2 codebreakers played an important part in intercepting messages from the enemy. Can you devise a code and use it to write a message to someone else?	Create a poster telling people how to behave during the Blackout. Make sure you tell them how important it is to follow the rules!	Money wasn't counted in pounds and pence during the 1940s. What can you find out about the different coins and ways of counting money?
3 Points	The conflict involved battles in the air and at sea. Play battleships to practice your coordinate knowledge. https://www.mathsisfun.com/games/battleship.html	During World War 2 everyone in Britain had to carry an identity card. Find out what one looked like and make one with your own details.	Find out who Vera Lynn was and listen to some of her music that was popular during WW2. Look in detail at the lyrics - why do you think it was so popular at this time?
