

Learning Project WEEK 4 - Animals

Age Range: Y3/4

• Daily <u>arithmetic</u> sessions – focussing on addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Working on <u>Times Table Rockstars</u> your child will have an individual login to access this.
- If your child works on '<u>Numbots</u>' in school they can access this with the same login.
- Play on <u>Hit the Button</u> focus on number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables.
- Daily <u>arithmetic</u> session focussing on digits values, partitioning and ordering – levels 3 and / or 4
- Continue to develop your <u>reasoning and problem-solving skills</u> by practising these puzzles. There are lots to choose from and some are more challenging than others!
- Get a piece of paper and ask your child to show everything that they have learned in their online Maths lesson from White Rose. This could be pictures, diagrams, explanations, methods etc. They can be as creative as they want to be.

Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- You could share a story together. This could be a chapter book where you read and discuss a chapter a day.
- Listen to your child read and let them discuss what they have read. Encourage them to read with expression and intonation.
- Watch <u>Newsround</u> and discuss what is happening in the wider world.
- Get your child to read a book on Oxford Owl, discuss what your child enjoyed about the book
- Undertake an AR guiz or other reading check
- Get your child to read a book on <u>Active learn</u> and complete the activities. These focus on comprehension skills.
- Explore new vocabulary you find when reading. What are the origins of this word?
 Can it be modified? Can you find any synonyms or antonyms for your new word?
- With your child, look in magazines, newspapers and books for new vocabulary they are unfamiliar with. They could use a highlighter to highlight in magazines and newspapers

Weekly Spelling Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Practise the Year 3/4 for <u>Common Exception</u> words.
- Practise your spelling on Spelling Shed

Spelling strategies - Common Exception Words. These activities are to be completed daily, if possible, in the home school learning book. Look, Say, Cover, Write, Spellings! Here are some other engaging ways to teach the new spelling rule using a dice to select the activity. Dicey Spelling! Roll the dice and see which activity you need to do! Silly Sentences Tell a Story Coinbow Wo Write a story using all of your spelling words. Make sure you Write silly sentences with a spelling word in each sentence. Underline your spelling words. underline your spelling words. First write your spelling words in pencil. Trace over the words 5 times, using a different coloured crayon each time. Example: My cat <u>wears</u> a yellow hat when she goes dancing. ROLL A TWO ROLL A THREE Blue Vowels **UPPER** and Lower Write each of your spelling words two times. Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about key animals they are interested in. Learning may focus on exploring the physical aspects of an animal, their habitat, categorising animals etc.

Let's Wonder:

Create fact files about <u>deadly predators</u>. Draw pictures of the predators and label them with information they find out. Where does the predator live? Why does it live there? What does it eat? How does it capture its prey? What special qualities do these predators have? Make a <u>food chain</u> to demonstrate why a predator is at the top of the chain. They could make a set of <u>top trump cards</u> using the information they found out.
