Arty Ideas for EYFS

Remember to upload any photographs to Google Classroom!

Drawing

Draw a picture of something from in your house or your garden (it may be a flower or toy). Make sure you look really carefully and draw everything you can see!

You could use pens, pencils, a writing pencil, chalk or even a biro. You might want to use more than one of these materials!

Printing

Rubbings - have a go making rubbings from different textured objects - look at the patterns they make. You could find different textures to use for your rubbings indoors or outdoors. If you wanted an extra challenge you could cut your rubbings out to make a picture!

Sculpture

Decide on something you would like to make a model of - it could be a building, a robot or a vehicle. Use whichever materials you have to hand (you might use Lego, boxes, junk, clay, carboard or play dough). See if you can get an adult to photograph it and send it in for us to see!

Painting

Have a go painting with different tools. You might want to draw a picture or just experiment!

You could use sticks, different sized brushes, sponges, fingers. If you don't have any paints - try making mixing mud with water to make a paint or paint with cold tea/coffee!

Textiles

Threading-have a go creating a necklace or hanging decoration!

You will need a piece of string or wool and either some beads or pasta, enjoy making wonderful patterns! If you don't have any beads you could try hole punching leaves and threading them!

Artist related

Have a look at Henri Matisse's later collage work.
