Arty Challenges for UKS2 - Years 5 and 6

Drawing

Practise drawing your favourite characters from a book, comic or computer game.
You can use whichever drawing materials you wish. Try to make them look 3D!

Painting

Create a painting of your choice that shows the variety of colour in the world around us — it could be a scene from your window you paint or an imaginative piece of work.

Textiles

Create a textile work of art!
Use scraps of fabric, wool, buttons, beads, sequins etc. Sew either an abstract piece of work or create a picture. It's a great activity for practising lots of different sewing skills! If you don't have needles and thread you can always create a textile collage by gluing the pieces on!



Printing

Have a go monoprinting — this means one print!

(some of you have done this in school!)

Use the back of a piece of tin foil (scrunch a frame around the edge so that the paint doesn't run off. Add paint (not too much) and spread it over the foil — using a cotton bud/ end of a paintbrush or something similar — draw a pattern or picture. Place a piece of paper over the top and press carefully making sure you don't move the paper, pull the paper up slowly and you should have your print. Don't worry if your first one isn't perfect you may need to use less/more paint, or more than one cotton bud etc. it takes a few times to get it just right!

Sculpture


Be inspired by buildings!

Use whatever materials you have at home – junk, card from boxes, scraps of wood, clay, play dough, Lego bricks etc. – your choice.

Design and create a 3D building – remember to think about how you will join different parts together, so they don't fall apart!
