

Learning Project WEEK 3 - Viewpoints

Age Range: Y3/4

• Daily <u>arithmetic</u> sessions – focussing on addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

 Working on Times Table Rockstars - your child will have an individual login to access this. If your child works on 'Numbots' In school they can access this with the same login. Play on Hit the Button - focus on number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables. Daily arithmetic sessions - focussing on addition, subtraction, multiplication and - levels 3 and 4. Continue to develop your reasoning and problemsolving skills by practising these puzzles. There are lots to choose from and some are more challenging than others! Get a piece of paper and ask your child to show everything that they have learned in their online Maths lesson from White Rose. This could be pictures, diagrams, explanations, methods etc. They can be as creative as they want to be. Daily Maths Lesson The above site also has daily Maths lessons which can be accessed online. These are available for Y3 and for Y4. 	 You could share a story together. This could be a chapter book where you read and discuss a chapter a day. Listen to your child read and let them discuss what they have read. Encourage them to read with expression and intonation. Watch Newsround and discuss what is happening in the wider world. Get your child to read a book on Oxford Owl, discuss what your child enjoyed about the book. Get your child to read a book on Active learn and complete the activities. These focus on comprehension skills. Explore new vocabulary you find when reading. What are the origins of this word? Can it be modified? Can you find any synonyms or antonyms for your new word? With your child, look in magazines, newspapers and books for new vocabulary they are unfamiliar with. They could use a highlighter to highlight in magazines and newspapers.

Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about different viewpoints.
