Collect some stones and rocks – try the beach but also think about things you might have at home, slate / brick / chalk etc. Investigate whether these rocks and stones are permeable. You could put the sample in water and see if any bubbles are seen as air is released, or you could weigh the sample, leave it in water for a while and the weight it again to see if any water has been absorbed. Record your findings.
