Revisit Set 2 sounds (see attached). Can you recognise all the sounds, in and out of words?	Practise the Number Bonds to Ten rhyme we have been learning in class (see attached). Can you recite the whole rhyme without support?
Use a coloured pen to underline the 'special friends' in Opie's latest book (<i>Opie and the</i> <i>GT</i>). Read the book to, or with, an adult. Can you spot any rhyming words?	Write at least one sentence about Opie's G7 encounter eg 'Opie skipped and jumped on the sand.' 'Boris let Opie play on Carbis Bay'. Remember to use your sounds, leave finger spaces between your words and read back your writing. Do you know where to place a full stop?
Sort your family's waste into two piles: a pile of waste that can be recycled and a pile of waste that cannot. Count how many items are in each pile. Which is the biggest pile? How could you reduce the number of non-recyclable items you throw away each week?	Design a holiday tea shirt for a G7 delegate (template attached). Your tea shirt should promote St. Ives/Carbis Bay eg by depicting some interesting places to visit, things to do or original features of our area.
Think of 5 or more ways that you can save water. Make a poster to encourage others to save water. Remember to lead by example!	Recycle some unwanted 'junk' (eg empty food packaging, lolly sticks, drinks container, newspaper) into something practical, beautiful or useful. Take a photo of your creation.
