Arty Ideas for LKS2 (YRs 3 & 4)

Remember to take photographs and upload them to Google Classroom!

Drawing

Make a drawing of something that is man-made and something that is natural.

Take time to look closely at the lines, shapes, patterns and textures on your chosen objects and try to reflect these in your drawing. Remember you can use lots of different surfaces and different drawing tools. Envelopes, wallpaper and biros all work well!

Printing

Have a go printing with cardboard.

Cut up some strips of cardboard making sure they are different lengths. Any sort of card will work and if you can use a few different types even better as they will print different widths. Dip the edges of the cardboard into paint and print away - you could create a picture, pattern or just enjoy printing!

Create a sculpture using cardboard shapes. Cut out a variety of sized shapes (they could all be one shape e.g. circles or a mixture of different shapes) cut slits in the shapes and slot them together. You could add colours or decorations to your sculpture.

Remember a sculpture is something that has form (it takes up space!)

Painting

Explore colour mixing! Remind yourself how to mix up the secondary colours (orange, purple and green) and how to make them darker and lighter. You could use these colours to create a picture or just have fun colour mixing and experimenting - it's the best way to learn about colour! Remember that using all the primary colours together make brown so be careful!

Textiles

Tie Dye - have a go tie dying a piece of fabric or old tee shirt. Gather up parts of the fabric and tie with string or elastic bands and put in your dye. Natural dyes work really well - try red onion skins, coffee or tea! Leave the natural dyes soaking overnight for the best results.

Artist related

Find out about the impressionist painter - Claude Monet. He liked to observe the light whilst working outdoors.
