

MESSY CHURCH

Messy Church happens on the second Sunday of the month here in St Uny Academy. About 50 people of all ages come to it!! BUT - what is it?? Mainly it is CHURCH - but not as we normally think of church!!

- Messy Church is a form of church for children and adults that involves creativity, celebration and hospitality. It is intergenerational we all do church together! It isn't just for children. Everyone is welcome: single, widowed, childless, divorced. Messy Church is inclusive, not exclusive.
- It's FUN!!
- It meets at a time (and sometimes in a place) that suits people who don't already go to a church. It isn't a ploy to get you to regular church Messy Church IS church in it's own right!
- We have a team who plan and lead, and we always welcome new ideas. We love to experiment!
- It typically includes a welcome, a long creative time to explore the biblical theme through getting messy; a short celebration time involving story, prayer, song, games and similar; and a sit-down meal together at tables. All elements are for, and include, people of all ages, adults and children. Here in St Uny we start with breakfast at 9am. (cereals, toast, and the "special" of the month.)
- We learn together, play together, do activities and crafts together.
- We aim is to introduce Jesus, and meet him, and to have an opportunity to grow closer to Him.
- Messy Churches meet all over the world google it!!
- Most Messy Churches meet once a month, as we do; and we are planning a few messy gatherings in between.
- Messy Church is an all-age church that offers counter-cultural transformation of family life through families coming together to be, to make, to eat and to celebrate God.

Why not try it? There's always a BIG poster about it in the school hall.
