On April 5th Year 5 children were shown a very special kind of apple tree with 5 different varieties on each tree. These included Gala and Braeburn plus three less well known kinds.

6 children were chosen to plant the two trees in the orchard - Connie, Freya Lily, Harry, Chelsea, Frazer and Ollie. The trees have blossom buds on each branch so will produce some apples this year. The orchard area has been closed for a few months in order to protect these young trees and allow the wild flower seeds recently planted by Year 3 to germinate and grow without disturbance. Our orchard area is recognised by FOE (Friends of the Earth organisation) as a haven for wildlife and is particularly important for our bees when the apple blossom is in flower very soon. It is a vital source of pollen and nectar at this time of year. David Woods - Outdoor Learning



Family Worker Drop In Sessions Monday 29th April 2019

Hayley Smith, Family Support Worker, will be available to speak to parents/carers during parents evening on Monday 29th April from 3pm to 5pm.

Family Workers can support:

- children with low level anxiety- increasing emotional resilience, recognising and managing their emotions, bereavement and family breakdown.
- parents to understand their child's behaviour when it is having a significant impact on the family
- meal/ bed time/ daily routines which are impacting on the family i.e. reduced school attendance or persistent lateness
- families, affected by complex issues, to avoid crisis
- families who need debt or housing advice which cannot be supported by a visit to CAB.

Hayley will be based in Mrs Brand's office in the KS1 area and would be pleased to talk to parents/ carers on Monday.
