

Arty Ideas for KSI (YRs 1 & 2)

Remember to upload any photographs to Google Classroom.

Drawing

Draw something that you can see in your home or outdoors.

Have a go drawing on a different surface - you may choose a cardboard box, sandpaper, tin foil, fabric, shells, egg boxes - see if you can think of some other good ideas!

Remember you can draw with pens, pencils, chalk, biro, writing pencils and lots more!

Painting

Explore colour mixing!

You could paint a picture or just enjoy the process.

Remember that by using the primary colours (red, yellow and blue) you can make the secondary colours (orange, green and purple).

Challenge yourself to create lighter and darker tones by adding black or white!

Printing

Have a go creating some patterns using everyday objects - you could try halving fruits and vegetables, printing with Lego, toy car tyres, leaves - surprise us with some other ideas! You could print a random, repeat or circular pattern!

Textiles

Explore Weaving!

Have a go creating a weaving - you can use lots of different sorts of materials. You can create a natural weaving by using things from the garden or create one using fabrics, threads and wool. Cut up plastic bags works well too!

Sculpture

Create something using recycled materials.

Make something new and unique from something that might be thrown away! You may choose to make it look like something or just explore placing the materials in different ways to create an eye-catching sculpture.

Remember a sculpture is something that has form (it takes up space!)

Artist related

Have a look at the abstract work of Dutch artist Piet Mondrian - look at his use of the primary colours and lines.
